Erin Bendily leads policy and strategy for the Pelican Institute for Public Policy, Louisiana's leading free-market think tank. Pelican exists to advance human flourishing across Louisiana by advancing new ideas, offering solutions to problems, and removing barriers to opportunity.

Erin has worked in education policy for approximately 20 years, advocating for students from early childhood through higher education, administering education programs, and offering policy solutions designed to help students reach their full potential and achieve economic opportunity that will benefit them and our beloved State of Louisiana.

Prior to joining Pelican, Erin led the Louisiana chapter of Propel America, a non-profit organization that trains and supports young adults as they transition from high school to careers. She also served as the Assistant Superintendent for Policy and Governmental Affairs at the Louisiana Department of Education, where she led the agency's policy agenda and served as a liaison and spokesperson to state and federal elected officials and other government agencies. A significant part of that work involved expanding educational options, accelerating improvement in student achievement, and preparing students for post-secondary education and the workplace.

Erin served as education policy advisor to Governor Bobby Jindal from 2008-2010. Prior to his gubernatorial administration, she served as deputy director for then Congressman Jindal's congressional district office after having supported university research projects and co-advised the statewide network of student government associations at the Louisiana Board of Regents.

Erin earned a bachelor's degree in business management from Southeastern Louisiana University, a master's degree in public administration from Louisiana State University, and Ph.D. in educational leadership and research from LSU. She, her husband, and their son live in Baton Rouge.
