James Waskom- Director of Governor's Office of Homeland Security ~
James Waskom, was appointed by Governor John Bel Edwards on January 11, 2016 as the Director of the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP). Through GOHSEP, Director Waskom is responsible for homeland security and emergency and disaster preparedness and response for the State of Louisiana. His office coordinates the State's activities to prepare for – prevent where possible – respond to, recover from

and mitigate against emergencies or disaster events.

As Director of GOHSEP and in carrying out his responsibilities for homeland security and emergency and disaster response and recovery, Waskom coordinates the activities of *all* agencies and organizations within the State and maintains liaison and cooperates with agencies and organizations of other States and of the Federal Government. He acts on behalf of the Governor in the event of an emergency or disaster as Deputy Incident Commander of the Unified Command Group (UCG). He is appointed by the Governor as the Homeland Security Advisor (HSA) for Louisiana and the Governor's Authorized Representative (GAR) with FEMA. He directs the activities of statewide interoperability projects and serves on the Regional Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness Directors Subcommittee (Regional Directors Subcommittee).


James Waskom, cont'd (information from http://gohsep.la.gov)

Director Waskom is a retired Colonel in the U.S. Army who served the United States for 33 years, including three combat tours during Operations Desert Storm and Iraqi Freedom/New Dawn, totaling 30 months in a combat zone. During that time, he was the leader of two organizations directly responsible for the safety and welfare of more than 50,000 soldiers, sailors, airmen, marines, Department of Defense civilians and foreign national workers. He previously owned his own law firm and practiced in the Acadiana region. He worked as a contract attorney with 15th Judicial District Court's Indigent Defender's Office. He is a former prosecutor in the 19th Judicial District and Inspector General of the Louisiana National Guard. He has a Master of Strategic Studies, MSS from the United States Army War College, a Juris Doctor, Law from Louisiana State University and is a Licensed Attorney.

Under his leadership, GOHSEP is managing approximately **\$18 billion** in Federal grants and more than 4,800 applicants involved in FEMA's grant programs for more than 35,000 separate projects.

Louisiana is a high-risk State for **emergency events** and disasters. In addition to numerous natural disasters – **hurricanes**, **floods**, **high winds** and **others** – that threaten our State, we are home to **critical supply routes** and **energy production resources** that are attractive targets for man-made disruptions.

The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP) was created by an act of the Louisiana Legislature – Louisiana Revised Statute (LRS) Title 29:725, the Louisiana Homeland Security and Emergency Assistance and Disaster Act (Louisiana Disaster Act). We are the agency responsible for coordinating the State's efforts throughout the emergency management cycle to prepare for, prevent where possible, respond to, recover from and mitigate against to lessen the effects of man-made or natural disasters that threaten our State.





Louisiana's Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) – a state-of-the-art command and control center – is operated within and staffed by GOHSEP. The State's response during an emergency or disaster is managed through the SEOC. When activated, the SEOC serves as a central operations center for emergency response.

The SEOC serves as the state Multi Agency Coordination Center (MACC) in order to coordinate and synchronize state agency and federal agency response to all incidents.

Mission

To lead and support Louisiana and its citizens in the preparation for, response to and recovery from all emergencies and disasters.

Vision

To be a center of **excellence** for emergency management and homeland security known for **leadership**, **innovation** and **service** for the benefit of Louisiana, its citizens and all other stakeholders.
