No More Common Core

As a state representative, Brett led the fight to remove Common Core from our schools in order to secure the constitutional right of local control over our children's education. The Fiscal Hawk

He championed the Coalition on Budget Reform and authored the "Geymann Rule,"— a signature bill that strongly limits the legislature's ability to use one-time money on recurring expenses. Soon after, Brett became known as the leader of the "Fiscal Hawks," a group of legislators working together for budget reform and responsible stewardship of the people's money. He served eight years on the Appropriations Committee as the elected member representing the 3rd Congressional District and fought against the flow of our tax dollars to the Saints franchise and voted against raising the expenditure limit.

Leading on the Issues

Brett Geymann has a proven track record of strong personal understanding of critical issues facing our country today. He authored immigration reform in 2008, long before this issue surfaced in the national spotlight. He voted to allow concealed-carry on school campuses and voted against gun control efforts by particular big-business special-interest groups. Brett is a strong proponent of term limits, at both the state and federal levels, and supports a lifetime ban on lobbying by former members of Congress. He is committed to leading by example and will self-impose both term limits and a lifetime ban on lobbying.

A Protector of The Constitution

Brett Geymann proudly supports the 2nd Amendment and all efforts to protect the sanctity of life. Given the honor of being selected the "Gentleman of the House" by his peers, Brett Geymann has earned an "A" rating from the National Rifle Association and a 100% approval rating from both Americans for Prosperity and Louisiana Right to Life. He has been honored to receive the Patrick Henry Award on numerous occasions as well as the Life and Liberty Award and a 95% lifetime rating from the Louisiana Family Forum.

Principles Above Party

In addition to his outstanding conservative record, Brett Geymann is considered a maverick, even within his own party. To call him an outsider would be disingenuous, but his principles have always overridden the status quo. There is a fundamental independence about him that has both excited and exasperated his colleagues on both sides of the aisle. Simply stated, Brett Geymann has the character of a true leader.
