Upcoming Election Information

The Fall Gubernatorial Election Nov. 21, 2015:

Early voting is November 7-14 (except Sunday and holidays) from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. for the Nov. 21st general election.

The 2016 Presidential Preference Primary Election will be held on March 5, 2016.

- Qualifying will be on December 2-4, 2015.
- The last day to register to vote in this election is February 3, 2016.
- Absentee by mail ballots may be requested until March 1, 2016. (Except for military stationed anywhere, civilians overseas, persons hospitalized, and sequestered juror voters)
- Early voting will be held February 20-27, 2016.

The April 9, 2016 municipal general:

- qualifying period is Dec. 2nd, 3rd and 4th until 4:30 p.m..
- state candidates qualify in the executive offices of Secretary of State Tom Schedler at 8585 Archives Ave., in Baton Rouge. There are no state candidates (other than president) scheduled to run in this election, however, a special election may be called in the event of a vacancy (secretary of state's office hours are 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.).
- local and municipal candidates qualify with the clerk of court in the parish in which they are registered to vote (contact your local clerk of court for office hours).
- view a list of qualifying fees (payment must be in the form of cash; certified or cashier's check on a state or national bank or credit union; United States postal money order; or money order issued by a state or national bank or credit union).
- download the standard fillable qualifying form or the presidential preference primary fillable qualifying form.
- early voting is March 26th thru April 2nd (except Sunday and holidays) from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. for the April 9th general election.

Republican Women of Southwest Louisiana Monthly meeting October 22, 2015 Reeves Uptown Catering

The meeting was called to order by President Roby Dyer

Karen Delpapa led the opening prayer. Jonell Wilkinson led the Pledge of Allegiance.

NEW Business:

The Nominating Committee presented the 2016 Slate of Officers as:

Janice Areno asked for other nominations form the floor. None were given. Kathy Trahan made a motion to accept the nominations. Tina Mosca seconded the motion. All were in favor; none opposed. The motion carried.

The guest speaker is Marc Ehrhardt with Louisiana Coalition. He explains, "What does the Gas Industry mean to the United States? We assume the industry will always be here. We need to pay attention to this industry. The people of the oil and gas industry can't be vocal to the local people because they are always at work. Louisiana Coalition is their "Voice". The people of the state depend on the oil and gas industry even if they don't notice. Some hotels rent rooms to primarily these workers. If it wasn't for the industry, there would be NO need for the hotel. Oil and gas provides 1 out of 6 jobs in the state of Louisiana. If you don't work in the industry, you know someone who does. They make higher incomes and they spend this money back into our area. We have the ability to refine the oil we find. Refineries are NO longer being built. They can only expand upon the existing ones. Louisiana has 16 of the largest refineries in the U.S. We are the #2 producer of oil and #2 producer of natural gas. Texas is #1. The average Louisiana Worker earns \$45,000/year. Oil and gas jobs earn an average of \$80,000-\$100,000/year. Louisiana has to stay competitive to the other states that want to "cash-in" on the oil and gas industry. Women make up 11% of those working in the oil and gas industry. This is more than ever before. Regulation and environmental investment is necessary. We need to maintain a healthy coast to protect our fishing industry. The oil and gas owns more land than anyone in Louisiana. So, of course the State wants to protect it. A fair legal system is also needed. Companies interested in the state of La come to look at our state as well as other states to see the legal risks, infrastructure and regulations involved. They need to know Louisiana is worth their investment. You are "Oil & Gas" because you are from Louisiana. Please check out "Grow La. Coalition". Tell others about the organization to help spread the word and educate all." Mr. Ehrhardt opened the floor to questions and closed.

President Roby Dyer presented a plaque to Mr. Ehrhardt, recognizing that pillows are being sent by our club, in his name, to U.S. soldiers serving in war zones overseas.
