#### **Upcoming Election Information**

#### **Fall Gubernatorial Election**

The following is important information for the **Nov. 21, 2015 general**:

• early voting is Nov. 7-14 (except Sunday and holidays) from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. for the Nov. 21st general election.

#### **Spring Presidential Preference Primary and Municipal Elections**

- The following is important information for the <u>March 5, 2016 presidential preference and municipal primary</u> and <u>April 9, 2016 municipal general</u>:
- qualifying period is Dec. 2nd, 3rd and 4th until 4:30 p.m.;
- state candidates qualify in the executive offices of Secretary of State Tom Schedler at 8585 Archives Ave., in Baton Rouge. There are no state candidates (other than president) scheduled to run in this election, however, a special election may be called in the event of a vacancy (secretary of state's office hours are 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.);
- local and municipal candidates qualify with the clerk of court in the parish in which they are registered to vote (contact your local clerk of court for office hours);
- view a list of qualifying fees (payment must be in the form of cash; certified or cashier's check on a state or national bank or credit union; United States postal money order; or money order issued by a state or national bank or credit union);
- download the standard fillable qualifying form or the presidential preference primary fillable qualifying form.
- early voting is Feb. 20-27 (except Sunday and holidays) from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. for the March 5th primary election; and
- early voting is March 26th thru April 2nd (except Sunday and holidays) from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. for the April 9th general election.

## **2016 Presidential Preference Primary**

A statewide presidential preference primary election is held on the 1st Saturday in March in 2016 and every 4th year thereafter for the purpose of allowing the electors of each political party in the state which has 40,000 or more registered members to express their preference for a person to be the nominee of the party for president of the United States.

- This election is a closed party election. There are only two political parties involved, the Democratic and Republican parties, because they have 40,000 or more registered members.
- Democratic voters may only vote on candidates for the offices of Democratic presidential nominee and Democratic state and local committees, plus any local offices and/or propositions.
- Republican voters may only vote on candidates for the offices of Republican presidential nominee and Republican state and local committees, plus any local offices and/or propositions.
- All other voters may vote only for any local offices and/or propositions if any are on the ballot.
- There are no runoff elections for the Democratic and Republican offices. A general election is held only if local offices are on the ballot and no one receives a majority vote in the primary election.
- The 2016 Presidential Preference Primary Election will be held on March 5, 2016.
- Qualifying will be on December 2-4, 2015.
- The last day to register to vote in this election is February 3, 2016.
- Absentee by mall ballots may be requested until March 1, 2016. (Except for military stationed anywhere, civilians overseas, persons hospitalized, and sequestered juror voters)
- Early Voting will be held February 20-27, 2016.

Roby Dyer welcomed guests and recognized new members. Martha Hains reminded us that it is time for renewing our membership for 2016. Each member was given an envelope with their membership registration enclosed and a gift was given for renewing today. Janice Areno was asked to help with the nominating committee for the upcoming officers for the 2016 year. The Nominating committee that was voted on and selected was Kathy Trahan, Laura Moody and Frieda Castillo. A motion to elect was made by Jonell Wilkinson, seconded by Marsha Spears, and the motion was carried

Vice President Birdie Harter introduced Dr. Keith DeSonier. Dr. Keith DeSonier is a Candidate for State Representative, District 36. He explains that he is a family man and is concerned with the health care issues that face our aging population. More medical professionals are entering the political arena because of the complex nature of our health care system. He is also concerned about providing the skills and education needed for the upcoming growth our area is experiencing. Education is also a top priority. The cuts to higher education have been crippling and need to be addressed immediately. Louisiana's tax structure needs to prioritize its spending and lay a foundation for economic growth for our future. Dr. DeSonier states that he is a medical doctor and a business man who has served in our military proudly and feels more than qualified for the open seat for State Representative. District 36.

Vice President Birdie Harter introduces State Representative Ronnie Johns, District 27, who is up for re-election. It does not take long for Representative Johns to get the issue on everyone's minds, the budget. He states we need budget tax regulations that lift up the middle class. He states the best government is a government ran by the people, a government that is limited, that adheres to the rule of law. Representative Johns has been a Pharmacist a State Farm Agent, a Senator 3 times and has brought conservative values to Baton Rouge every time we have elected him to serve. A cause that is close to his heart is human trafficking. He has recently gone to Rome to ask others, who have more experience, what Southwest Louisiana can do to better deal with this terrible problem. Another problem that must be addressed is the tax loop holes that out of state companies enjoy at Louisiana's expense. For example, the movie tax breaks that are in place now. He also wants to cap higher education budget cuts. Representative Johns ask for our help and used the quote from Edmond Burke "All that is needed for evil to prevail is for good men to do nothing."

Lana Hafner gave Senator Johns a One Touch blanket for his new grandson.

Tickets were drawn for the door prize. The meeting is adjourned.
